Insight on the Anthem

Today's choral offering is an arrangement of the well-known hymn, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." The hymn was first published anonymously in 1799; the author was later identified as Reverend Edward Perronet. Perronet's grandparents were part of the Huguenot movement in France—French Protestants who were forced to flee Catholic France into Switzerland and England. Edward Perronet's father became an Anglican vicar, and Edward followed in his father's footsteps. Edward became the pastor of a small independent church in Canterbury, serving there until his death in 1792. His last words were: "Glory to God in the height of His divinity! Glory to God in the depth of His humanity! Glory to God in His all-sufficiency! Into His hands I commend my spirit!"
